To make your own guidelines for other pens widths:

- multiply the pen width by 5 for the distance between the base line and the x-height line.
- add 1 to 2 pen widths for both the ascender and descender spaces.
- adding vertical lines to the four guidelines will help to keep your strokes nice and straight.

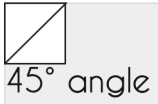
